lobby:	<p>designed by broadway and architectural lighting designer, david lander has conceived a striking, wall-sized installation customized for the lobby of alden-houston. colors morph across the surface representing the more fantastic hues found in nature. cool, cascading blue and rich lavenders take you on a flight through sunset; deep vibrant reds conjure up images of nightfall’s bewitching potency. in “choose your own fantasy fashion,” this permanent work is aptly entitled “Invitation.”</p> <p>the spirit of texas rises again as captured through the eyes of austin artist, kim coulter, an established representational painter. “wild horses,” a massive painting of running horses flanks one of the hotel lobby walls—a move designed to reinvigorate the hotel’s texas origins.</p> <p>in stark contrast to the western art is the unique metal sculptures of m.y. williams, a houston artist, whose three custom metal pieces measuring 5’, 6’ and 7’ greet guests immediately upon entering the lobby. williams’ art appeals to both the contemporary collector and the traditional collector.</p>
